

# LAND'S END ASSOCIATION

## POLICIES & GUIDELINES

We invite you to share in the safety of our neighborhood and the beauty of our area by complying with these Policies and Guidelines:

Please be sensitive to this year around community and **limit noise before 8:00 AM and after 10:00 PM.**

### Speed Limits:

Our first concern is safety as our population includes walkers of all ages, bicyclists, and a menagerie of pets and wildlife. Driving at the posted speed limits and stopping at intersections will help prevent accidents and significantly reduce the amount of dust and wear & tear on the roads. Speed limits are 20 MPH on the paved road and 15 mph on the gravel roads or less if conditions dictate.

### Parking:

There is no parking along any Land's End road, right of way, or at the water landing area at any time. Vehicles at the landing area are permitted only for drop off or pick up and must be removed immediately.

### Launching Boats:

Boats on trailers are permitted on the rock beach area only. Boats on trailers may not be launched from marsh areas. We discourage launching activity by those who are not Land's End Association members. You may be approached regarding your affiliation with Land's End, so please give the property owner's name if you are asked.

Note: The summer of 2013 saw four separate occurrences of kayak thefts in this area. Storing watercraft in the landing area is at your own risk.

### Dogs:

Dogs must be leashed in all areas of Land's End, including the landing area and water. You must pick up after your dog and dispose of the waste at the property where you are staying.

### Trash Collection:

Trash is collected on Tuesdays at the end of each member's driveway. Trash should be set out in containers with lids on Monday evening or by 6:15 a.m. on Tuesday morning. Do not set trash out on Monday night if it is not in a container – we have many foraging critters here who make a mess of plastic bags.

### Recycling Collection:

Recycled items are collected every other Tuesday and collected at the three-way fork. (The recycling schedule can be found on the Town website at [www.kennebunkportme.gov](http://www.kennebunkportme.gov). Click on "Departments", then "Solid Waste/Recycling".) Items collected: Newspapers, magazines, mixed paper, paperboard, corrugated cardboard, glass, metal, and plastics #1 to #7. Items can be co-mingled.

### Returnable bottles and cans:

If you choose not to redeem your returnable bottles and cans, rather than put them with the recyclables, they can be dropped off at the designated “dumpster” located in the Police Communications parking lot (at the intersection of School Street and Old Cape Road). Volunteers take the returnable bottles and cans to a redemption center and the proceeds benefit programs for children in Kennebunkport and other Town service projects.
